Colonel Grover A. DuBose



Colonel Grover A. DuBose, a Distinguished Military Graduate of West Virginia State College Army ROTC in 1950, was born in Birmingham, Alabama, on October 26, 1928.

Prior to his retirement from the military, his many assignments included being an Artillery Battery Executive Officer in Korea; Battery Commander of a Field Artillery Battery at Fort Sill, Oklahoma and an Air Defense Artillery Battery in Alaska; Instructor at the Air Defense School at Fort Bliss, Texas and in the R.O.T.C. Program at South Carolina State College; Artillery Advisor to the Republic of China's 1st Field Army; a Staff Officer on the Department of Army Staff in Washington, D.C. and on the NATO Headquarters Staff in Holland; Artillery Battalion Commander in Germany and in Vietnam; and Controller for the European Command in Germany.

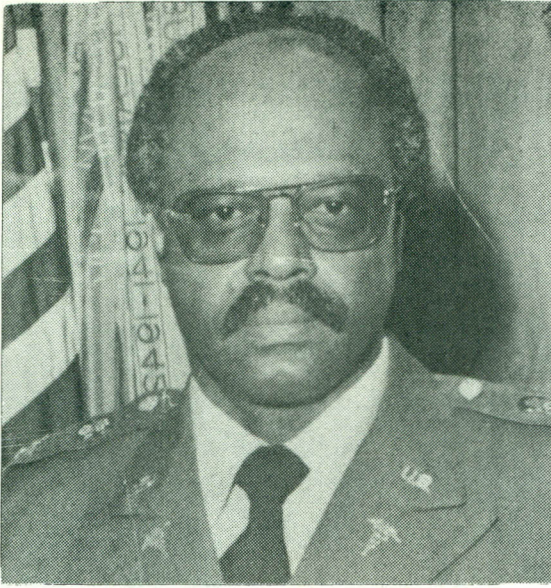
Colonel DuBose holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration from West Virginia State College and a Masters Degree in Business Administration from Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania.

His Military education includes the Artillery School, Basic and Advanced Courses; the Foreign Service Institute; the United States Army Command and General Staff College; and the Armed Forces Staff College.

Colonel DuBose's military awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters, Bronze Star, Air Medal with Clusters, Army Communication Medal, and the Department of Army General Staff Badge.

After a distinguished military career that spanned 24 years, Colonel DuBose joined the Sears Organization as Executive Staff Assistant, Affiliated Factory Relations at the National Headquarters in Chicago, Illinois. Since 1974, he has also served as an Official on numerous business, community, and hospital boards. In 1977, his authority at Sears was greatly expanded, encompassing seven buying units, including the Retail Marketing Staff and Catalog Marketing Staff.

Colonel DuBose is now National Merchandise Manager, Housewares for Sears, Roebuck and Company at the Chicago, Illinois National Headquarters.



Colonel James M. Garrison

Colonel James M. Garrison, a Distinguished Military Graduate of the West Virginia State College Army ROTC in 1950, was born in Lewisburg, West Virginia on August 15, 1927.

Colonel Garrison entered the Army as an Artillery Officer upon graduating Magna Cum Laude from "State" and served in succession as Executive Officer, Battery Commander, and S3 in the 98th Field Artillery Battalion at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Temporarily leaving Active Duty, he attended Medical School and at the same time served as Survey Officer with the 356 Field Artillery Battalion (Reserve) in Cambridge, Mass.

Upon returning to Active Duty as a physician, his career was highlighted by assignments as Staff Obstetrician-Gynecologist (Ob-Gyn) Officer, Chief Ob-Gyn Services, Chief of Surgery, Assistant Chief of Professional Services, and Division Surgeon for the 24th Infantry Division. Leaving the Service in 1969, he remained in the United States Army Medical Corps (Reserves). During the March 1969-June 1980 period, he served in the Army Reserves with the 50th General Hospital in Seattle Washington, in a succession of assignments from Chief of radiology, Chief of Professional Services to Commanding Officer of the Hospital.

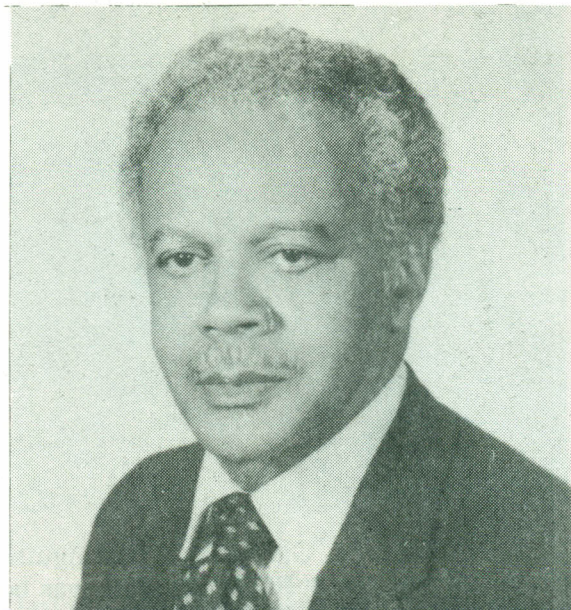
Since leaving the service, Dr. Garrison has served as Assistant Chief of Staff for Central Hospital; Chief of Ob-Gyn Department at Central; and Staff Ob-Gyn, Group Health Co-operative of Puget Sound (a hospital, six peripheral clinics, and a specialty clinic serving approximately 140,000 people).

Dr. Garrison holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Chemistry from West Virginia State College and a Doctor of Medicine Degree from Tufts University Medical School. Both his Internship and his Residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology were performed at the Madigan Army Hospital.

Among his many medals and awards are the Legion of Merit, the Army Commendation Medal and the Parachute Badge.

Colonel Garrison is now Chief of Staff, Central Region, Group Health Co-operative of Puget Sound.

Lieutenant Colonel Nelson R. Bickley



Lieutenant Colonel Nelson R. Bickley, a graduate of the West Virginia State College Army ROTC in 1952, was born in Cincinnati, Ohio on February 21, 1928.

Colonel Bickley's interesting and productive life has successfully spanned three careers. His career in the Army was highlighted by assignments as an Air Defense Artillery Battery Commander in Germany and Korea; Operations and Training Officer in the 35th Brigade at Fort Meade, Maryland; Battalion Logistical Officer in Germany; Battalion Executive Officer in Korea; Sub-Post Commander in Schweinfurth, Germany; and Assistant Professor of Military Science in the ROTC Program at West Virginia University in Morgantown, West Virginia.

As Foreign Student Advisor and Director of Minority Student Affairs at West Virginia University, he began his civilian career in the student services field of higher education. Moving next to his Alma Mater, he became Director of Guidance and Placement. He subsequently served for eighteen months as West Virginia State's Acting Provost for Student Services. In 1980, he began his third and present career as a practicing lawyer in the Charleston, West Virginia area.

In addition to receiving a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History from West Virginia State College, he has a Masters Degree in Counseling and Guidance and a Doctorate of Jurisprudence from West Virginia University. His military education includes the Air Defense Officer's Basic Course at Fort Bliss, Texas; the Field Artillery Officer's Advanced Course at Fort Sill, Oklahoma; and the Nuclear Weapons Course in Seneca, New York.

Colonel Bickley is now a successful practicing attorney with the Law Office of Bland, Jacobs, Bickley and Barkus.
