A Brief History of the West Virginia State University National "W" Club

On a fall West Virginia Sunday morning in 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston, West Virginia hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm as to how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a very distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club elected at the 1976 meeting were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer, and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome, and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris; Mark H. Cardwell; Samuel A. Gamble; Vasco D. Hale; Adolph P. Hamblin; Louis R. W. Johnson; Earl Lloyd; Floyd Meadows; Roderick L. Price, and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger, and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on the campus was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr. on October 13, 1990. This facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes.

A special note of thanks to President Carter for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.


ALBERT "CHUBBY" HUGHES Class of 1973

Albert "Chubby" Hughes is the son of Lucinda "Boots" Hughes and the late Albert J. Hughes, Sr. During his high school career, he was a 3 year, four sports star in baseball, basketball, football and track. "Chubby" was a three-time All-State selection in baseball and was significant in leading his team to the State Championship as well, as runner-up in basketball. He was recognized by his class as "Outstanding Male Athlete".

Upon graduation from high school, he was drafted by the Houston Astros professional baseball organization. He chose however, to sign and play for Marshall University on a baseball/basketball scholarship. He transferred to West Virginia State College in 1970 to continue his education and sports endeavors. He went on to become an All-Conference WVIAC selection as a second base utility player. "Chubby" was also a letterman for the "Yellow Jackets" basketball team. He pledged Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity Tau Chapter WV State. Albert graduated in 1973, with a BA in Political Science and Economics. He worked as a lab analyst for Monsanto BASF and Pittsburgh Paints performing chemical analysis. He also had ten years with the West Virginia Regional Jail Authority.

Currently, Albert resides in Beckley, WV and is a member of the John Scott Lodge #1070 of the IBPOE of the World, Inc. He has also been honored with the induction into the Woodrow Wilson Sports Hall of Fame. Albert has two daughters and five grandchildren. He also has one sister, Pamela, an educator and graduate of WVSU and one brother Dr. Timothy Hughes, DDS., graduate of Marshall University and WVU Dental School.


Oliver E. Hunter was born the youngest of six children to Mary E. Tolson, in Washington, DC. His mom was his heart and inspiration, influencing him to excel in all his endeavors.

Oliver's high school track coach, Mike Gallion, WVSU Hall of Famer, played a huge part in influencing him to attend college. He guided him and mentored him throughout high school. Mr. and Mrs. William Caves, alumni of WVSU, also gave him the inspiration to succeed in all areas of his life.

Oliver was accepted to West Virginia State College in 1971 and received a Bachelor of Arts Degree. As a freshman, he won the 100 and 220 yard dash and was high point man in the State Championship. In a dual meet between WVSC and Morehead State University, Oliver ran a 9.7 in the 100 yard dash and 20.9 in the 220 yard dash. In that same meet, "State" came from behind in the last race, the mile relay of Hunter, Jones, Gilmer and Crummel and won the meet 74-71.

Oiver said, "My time at West Virginia State was not only great for education, but productive. I enjoyed the school's faculty and met many good people".

He was inducted into the Cordozo High School Track Hall of Fame on June 5, 2011. Oliver's most proud accomplishment is "Just being a good father to all six of my children, who are doing very good in life". He has been employed by Rosendrof/Evans from 1980 to the present.

FOUR YEAR STARTER IN BASKETBALL WVIAC All-CONFERENCE 1st TEAM

William J. Kirk, Jr. enrolled at West Virginia State College in the fall of 1966, after being recruited by Coach Frank Enty. He was a 4 year starter on the "Yellow Jackets" basketball team. During that time, "State" had four winning seasons and several championship appearances in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Basketball Tournament.

After graduating from "State" in 1970 with a degree in Zoology, he pursued a career in Veterinary Medicine. In the summer of 1978, Bill received a Masters Degree in Veterinary Parasitology, from the Tuskegee Institute School of Veterinary Medicine. He was accepted into the Doctorial Program in 1982 and was awarded the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine Degree from the Tuskegee Institute. Dr. Kirk completed an internship in Large Animal Medicine and Surgery, at the University of Florida, School of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. William W. Kirk has been married to Mrs. Hattie J. Kirk for thirty-six years and they have five children, who are all college graduates. Dr. Kirk is presently a Veterinary Practitioner in Birmingham, Alabama.



JAMES"JIM" RUSSELL NASH (Deceased) Class of 1932

James (Jim) Russell Nash was a multi talented athlete who overcame many hardships in his life. He was born the second child of fourteen children, in Monongalia County, West Virginia. He excelled as a star athlete in high school and was rewarded

with a scholarship to attend "State", where he was the college's first four sport letterman. Jim played basketball as a guard, in football he played quarterback, center field in baseball and participated in track & field. In his senior year he was honored as a member of the 1931 Negro All-American football team.

After receiving his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1932, Jim obtained a teaching position in Bluefield, West Virginia. In the mid thirties, his family encouraged him to relocate to Akron, Ohio to help his mother and thirteen siblings through hard times. He found that teaching positions were hard to come by and that his fire for competition was stronger than ever. While working hard in low paying jobs, Jim played and coached his way to championships in Negro baseball and basketball leagues, enjoying the privilege of playing beside his brother Robert.

Jim was dedicated to helping troubled young men and made it a mission to give them support and guidance. He was fortunate to have received a job with B.F. Goodrich, so he used his influence to start up many organizations such as, the Young Men's Business & Professional Club. In recognition of his commitment to community service, he was awarded the Youth Service Award by the Akron Touchdown Club. During the riots of 1968 in Akron, he was called upon by civic leaders to help soothe tensions that agitated the city. Jim was determined to find even more ways to serve his community. He was a Special Deputy with the Summit County Sheriff's Department and ran for the Akron City Council, all while working full time for B.F. Goodrich/Goodyear Tire & Rubber, where he retired after 33 years of service.

James Russell Nash died on New Year's Eve in 1973, leaving behind a loving wife, four daughters and eight grandchildren. All his family confirm, that for as brilliant an athlete Jim was, he was an even greater man.

Harry graduated in 1983 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Management.

He was commissioned as 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Army, where he served proudly for 8 years. Since leaving the Army, Harry has had a productive career with Hertz Corporation as City Manager for 15 years. He also served as Operations Manager for 3 years with Avis/Budget and is currently a Senior Logistics Analyst for Claxton Logistics Services.

After settling down in Stafford, Virginia in 1994, Harry coached Little League football, basketball and soccer. He enjoys volunteering his time to the Virginia Youth Football League and many other community programs.

His athletic abilities earned him a scholarship to West Virginia State College to play football. Steve was a four year starter during his time at "State". In his sophomore year, he played both tight end and defensive end. His junior year he was named All-Conference defensive end. In Steve's senior year, he was named All-Conference and All-American defensive end.

After graduating from "State" in 1975, Steve was employed with the United Steel Corporation as an Industrial Engineer. He left US Steel to join the Department of Labor as a Senior Coal Mine Safety Inspector in Denver, Colorado. Steve was the youngest and one of only fifteen African-American mine inspectors in the country.
