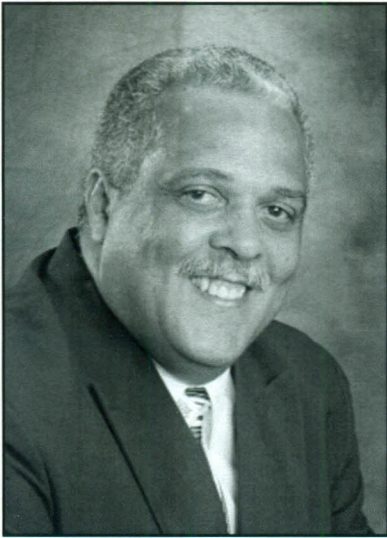

A Brief History of the West Virginia State University National "W" Club

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC, was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price, and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on October 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes.

A special note of thanks to President Emeritus Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.

Debra Anderson was inspired and encouraged at a young age by her parents, the late Elmer C. and Ruth Anderson of South Charleston, WV. Her dad, a heavy equipment operator at the Dupont plant in Belle, and her mom, the first black registered nurse in West Virginia to work at St. Francis Hospital in Charleston, had high expectations for their daughter. Debra enjoyed playing every intramural sport in high school. Her senior year at South Charleston High, she was named "Most Athletic Girl".

Her freshman year at State, she tried out and made the basketball team, starting as a center. Debra was one of the tallest women in the conference that year, standing at 5'10". She had many highlights in her career, but the one that stands out more than any other was in her sophomore year. She scored 10 points and had 12 rebounds at the Civic Center, beating Morris Harvey College (University of Charleston). Debra not only excelled on the court but made the Dean's List and was elected to Who's Who Among Students in American Universities & Colleges in 1975 and 1976.

Debra received a master's degree in physical education at the University of Tennessee in 1979. She returned to West Virginia where she taught elementary physical education for 11 years in Kanawha County Schools. For the next seven years she taught physical education and coached at Elyria West High School in Ohio. Debra just completed her 15th year as Assistant Professor and Chair of the Health, Human Performance and Leisure Studies department here at West Virginia State University.

Debra is married to Gregory L. Conliff. They both have represented WV in senior sports. She enjoys teaching Sunday school and is in the Mime Ministry at Bible Believers Fellowship. Her interests are playing tennis (won 55 women's doubles in the Charleston Public Courts for two years in a row), working out and trying new recipes. Debra and her husband enjoy watching the Yellow Jackets.

Craig Carse was born, raised and educated in West Virginia. He holds degrees from Bethany College and West Virginia University.

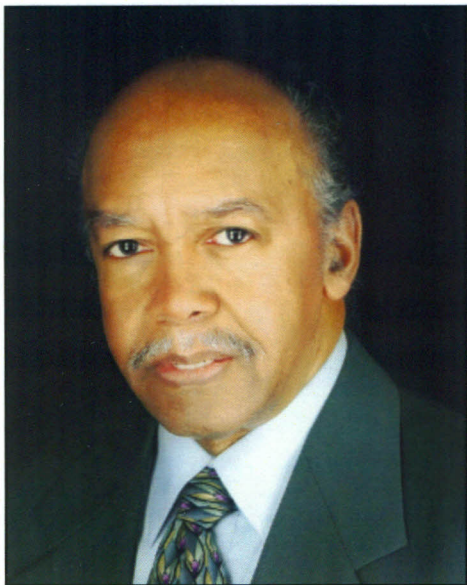

Phillip "Tuffy" Hill is the son of Ruby Hill of Institute, WV, and the late James Hill, Sr. He has one brother, James Hill, Jr., also of West Virginia. After graduating from Dunbar High School, Phillip enrolled at WVSC (University) where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree. He went on to receive his Master of Arts degree from Wayne State University.

During Phillip's time at State he became an avid swimmer and champion diver. He was one of the swimmers instrumental in transitioning the team from CIAA to the WVIAC in 1958. As a team diver, "Tuffy's" attitude was to never fail and be perfect in scoring points. His legacy is etched in State history by being a member of the 1960 Championship Swim Team. Phillip's competitive spirit and drive established the winning tradition for swim teams. He was also a member of the tennis team, where he demonstrated his athleticism on the court.

Phillip has worked for Chrysler Corporation for the past 43 years while demonstrating his artistic abilities as a renowned artist with exhibitions all over the country. He also shares a graphic arts design and printing business with his daughter. Phillip is an inventor and holds the patent for a golf game. He is also nationally ranked table tennis player, a youth mentor in Detroit, an African Art collector and a Prince Hall Mason.

"Tuffy" is a loving family man, devoted to his wife Judy of 45 years, his son Phillip Jr., daughter Shaunda and his granddaughter Eniah. Phillip's days at State were memorable, and his alma mater will always be near and dear to his heart.

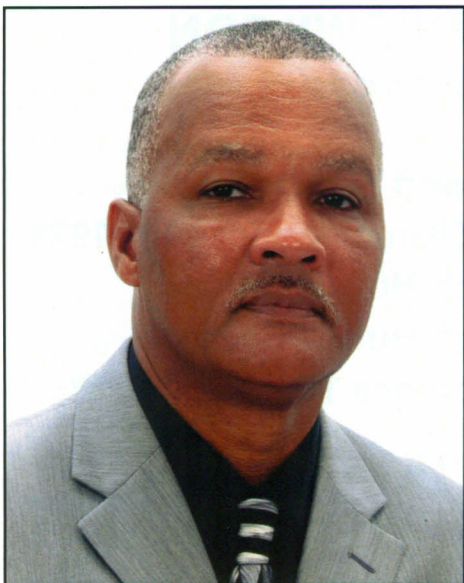
Tyrone Taylor was born in Logan, West Virginia, on September 18, 1951, to his proud parents Annie Mae Ball and Walter Taylor. His brothers were Eddie Taylor and George Ball, both of whom attended West Virginia State. He attended Logan High School until 1968, where he played for Coach Elliot Musilack. Tyrone then attended Man High School and played football and track under Coach Richard ("Dickie") Barber.

Coach "Buck" Dawson recruited Tyrone to run track at State in 1970. He was the anchorman on both the 4x110 yard relay and the 4x440 yard relay, setting both school and WVIAC conference records. Tyrone ran on some of the fastest relay teams in the state, which qualified him to participate in the NAIA Championships in Kansas City, Kansas, and Billings, Montana. Tyrone broke the conference record in the 440 yard dash, which he also competed in at the NAIA Championship Meets. Some of the Track Meets he competed in were: Penn Relays, Ohio State Relays, Ohio University Relays, Mountaineer Relays, VMI Relays and Kentucky Relays, just to name a few. Tyrone was instrumental in leading State to four WVIAC Team Championships and four Individual All Conference honors. He was a true anchor man.

Tyrone was married to Leslie Hamlet Taylor, and he had one daughter, Tyra. He was a professional billiards player, winning tournaments in Indiana, Chicago, Logan and Charleston, WV.

Tyrone Taylor passed away in 1998.

Keith Wade was born in Welch, WV, to the late James and Elizabeth Wade. He graduated from Gary High School in 1978, where he lettered in basketball and track. He was named Outstanding Senior Athlete and was Captain of the Class AA All State Second Team in basketball. As a senior, Keith also assisted his track team in setting a state record in the 880 relay. As his senior season concluded, he was selected to play in the Pony All Star North-South Basketball game, where he scored 13 points toward the team's win with a final score of 141-135.

In January of 1979, Keith enrolled at State and walked on to the basketball team in October of that year. As a freshman guard he played a major role in the team, reaching the WVIAC Tournament Championship game. He became the starting point guard in his sophomore, junior and senior seasons, leading the team in assists. Keith was the team's second leading scorer in his junior and senior years.

Keith graduated in 1983 with a bachelor of science in Business Administration. He is employed by Praxair, Inc., with 23 years of service. Keith and his wife, Seaondra, have been married 28 years and are the proud parents of one daughter, Shamika, and have one grandson, Kailan.

Phillip "Phil" Wilson is a native of Charleston, WV, and the first son of the late Phillip and Edna Wilson. Phil graduated from South Charleston High School in 1969, where he excelled in track and field.

In the fall of 1969, Phil enrolled at State and continued his distinguished track career. He was an integral part in winning four straight conference championships under the leadership of Coach Buck Dawson. Phil participated in the 120 high hurdles and the 440 yard intermediate hurdles. He was outstanding in the high hurdles, setting the school record and contributing to the conference championship in 1970.

During his track career, Phil was fortunate to have had the opportunity to compete in various track meets at schools such as Ohio State, University of Kentucky, Marshall, WVU and many others.

After graduating in 1974 with a Bachelor of Science, Phil began a career in the financial service industry at General Motors Acceptance Corporation. He retired in 2005 with 31 years of service. After retirement, he started a business and is now the owner of P&R Travel Agency.

Phil and his wife, Renee, currently reside Atlanta, Georgia, and are the parents of sons Phillip, Jr., and Jeffrey. They also have five grandchildren and enjoy every moment spent with their family.

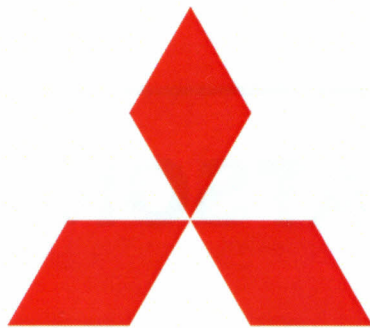

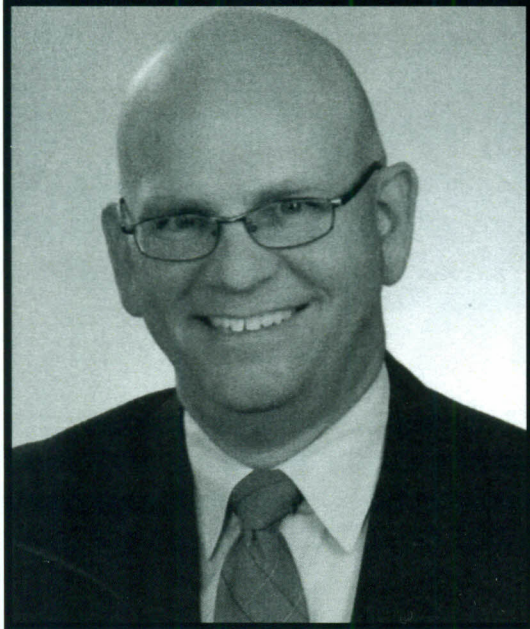

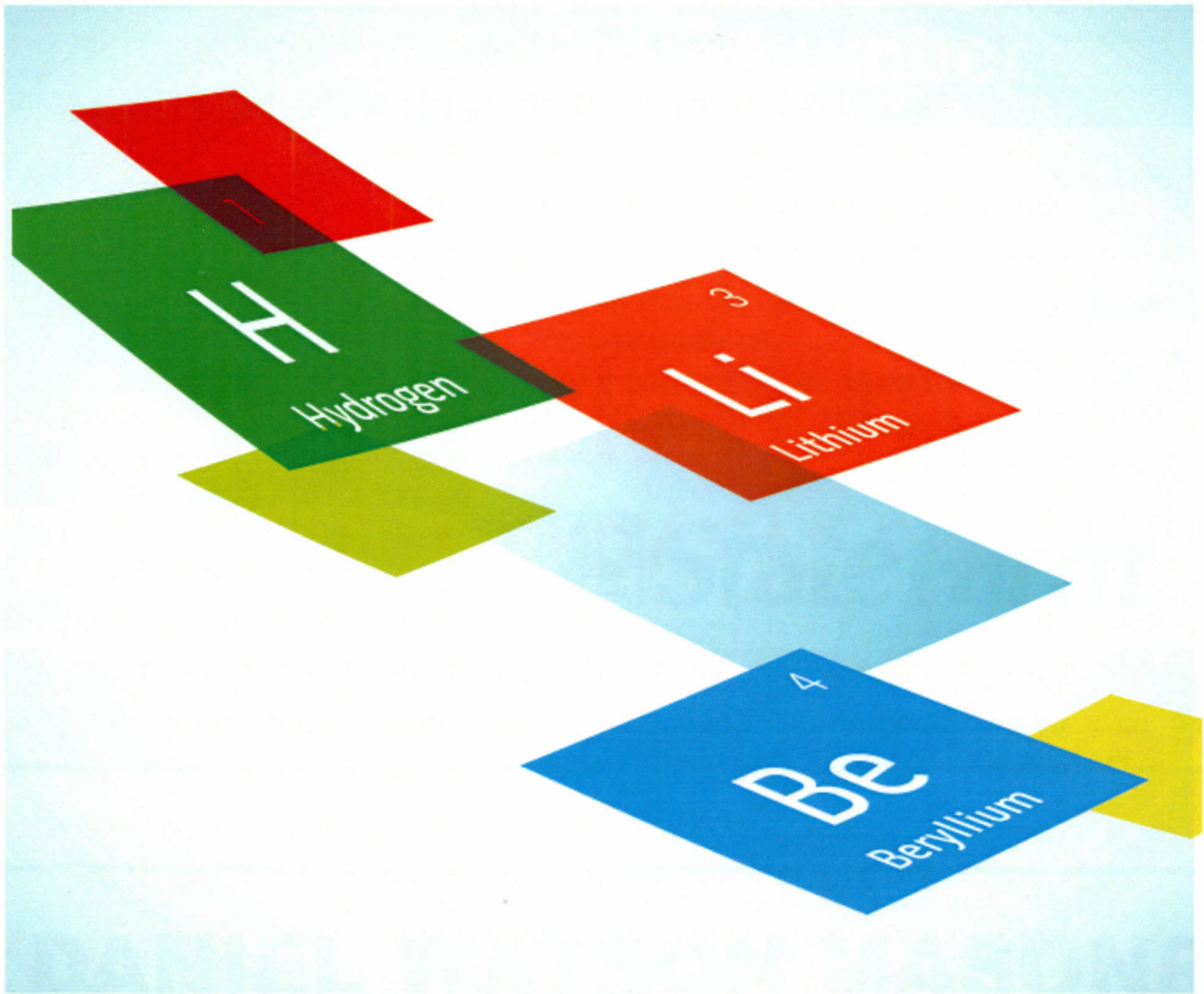
