

A Brief History of the West Virginia State University National "W" Club

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics, as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome, and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC, was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shenandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishment of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price, and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger, and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on October 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes.

A special note of thanks to the late President Emeritus Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.

John Wesley "Jack" Craig was born on March 1, 1937 in Washington, DC. He is the youngest of six siblings born to the late Ellsworth A. Craig and Etta M. Craig. He graduated from Armstrong High School in 1956. Craig was recruited

as a student-athlete and was awarded a football scholarship to pursue his education at West Virginia State College.

While at State, Jack was a four-year letterman. As a freshman, he made an immediate impact on the team. He was a starter and played on both sides of the ball. As an offensive running back and a defensive corner back, he could be counted on to make the big play such as leading the Yellow Jackets to a 14-0 win over Salem College by rushing for 131 yards. A member of the WVIAC All-Conference First Team and two time Sweater Award recipient, Jack is credited among the outstanding players to have competed in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Conference.

Jack's contributions off the field were also notable as the WVSC Vice President of the Student "W" Club and a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity. He graduated in June of 1961 with a Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Arts.

He was among the six founders of the Shenandoah Valley "W" Club and continues to support WVSU student-athletes by volunteering his time and working on membership drives and fundraisers.

Jack is married to Barbara Craig. They are the proud parents/grandparents of daughter Monique, son Drake (Melissa), and three grandchildren Taylor, Drake, and Dillan.



Arnett graduated from South Charleston High School in 1994 where he was an All-Conference and All-State football player as a defensive back. He was recruited by several schools, but decided to stay close to home and play football for the West Virginia State Yellow Jackets.

Arnett made an immediate impact as he stepped on campus and was named the starting free safety as a freshman. In his sophomore year, Arnett received WVIAC Honorable Mention recognition for his stellar play as a free safety. When Carl Lee was appointed the football coach his junior and senior year, he had unbelievable success when he was moved to the cornerback position. He was selected WVIAC First Team All-Conference as a junior for his outstanding play at that position. With the encouragement of Coach Lee and the extended invitation from the track coach, Arnett decided to run track his junior year. During that time, Arnett was WVIAC First Team All-Conference in the 200 meters and 4x100 meter team that was conference champions. He was voted by his teammates and coaches as Team Captain his senior year for his dedication on and off the field. He was again selected WVIAC First Team All-Conference for the second year in a row as a senior. Because of his outstanding achievements on the field and in the classroom, Arnett received the National "W" Club Outstanding Junior and Senior Athlete Award.

He graduated from West Virginia State earning a B.S. in Business Management. He enjoys working with the youth football and basketball programs as the Recreation Director for the City of South Charleston, WV. Arnett has one daughter, Leah, two sons, Cameron and Brenden, and one sister, Eunice. He is especially grateful to have played with amazing teammates and under outstanding head coaches and staff at West Virginia State University.

WVSU HEAD TENNIS COACH



Coach John Simms is the son of Tom and Mary Simms and grew up in neighboring Dunbar, WV, where he currently resides. He has two brothers, Kevin and Andy Combs. John's father introduced him to tennis and encouraged him to play and learn the game before he passed away in 1973. A 1976 graduate of Dunbar High, Coach Simms went on to play collegiate tennis for Morris Harvey College (now the University of Charleston). After leaving Morris Harvey, he went on to serve as Director of Nitro Parks and Recreation, Director of Junior Tennis at the Charleston YMCA, and later the Charleston Tennis Club. He also served as Tennis Director at the Carbide Tech Center Tennis Club and at Edgewood Country Club. He later ran his own tennis program based out of the Tennis Indoor Center in Charleston. During those years he developed and coached seven nationally ranked junior players, was Director of the West Virginia U.S. Tennis Association Junior Area Training Center, and was selected 14 times to coach Midwest section junior teams in national competitions.

Simms left school before graduating, but returned to finish his Bachelors' Degree at West Virginia State in 2004. Coach Simms took over the WVSU tennis program in July 2003 and built the women's team into a nationally-ranked program and the dominant one in its conference in just a few years. During the first 12 years under his leadership, the Yellow Jackets won six conference titles, four conference tournament championships, posted a conference record of 75-27, and qualified for eight consecutive NCAA tournaments.

His exceptional guidance produced four Conference Player of the Year award winners and five Freshman of the Year recipients. Coach John Simms was named conference Coach of the Year seven times in his first 12 years on the job. His overall record entering the spring 2015 season was 154-98.



Being one of the strongest players on the team, he stood out as one of the best at making sacks and tackles. He was an inspiration to his teammates by always encouraging them to elevate their game to another level while also being inspired by his teammates.

Robert placed 2nd in shot-put and 2nd in pole vaulting in the 1983 WVIAC Track meet. He attributes his athletic success to he teammates, his family and two very special coaches, J.C Arban of Pearl River Junior College and Coach Oree Banks of State. He has appreciation for both coaches, but Coach Banks made a profound impact on his life and helped make Robert the man he is today.

Robert and his wife Janice live in Cross Lanes, WV and he is employed by REM West Virginia as a provider of services to people with intellectual and development disabilities. He and his wife are very active members of All Nations Revival Center.

That season they were runner-up in the WVIAC Basketball Tournament. Pete was the WVIAC Honorable Mention for the 1980-81 basketball season.

Pete graduated in 1981 with a B.A. in Fine Arts. He has been able to accomplish many things by earning that degree, such as illustrate the handbook cover for the Monterey Blues Festival; painted the 25th Anniversary Commemorative Poster for the National Caucus and Center on Black Aged; and coordinated the Congressional High School Art Contest for Congresswoman Cynthia McKinney District 4.

Valerie Colquitt Wright, a native of Philadelphia, PA, graduated from Overbrook High School in 1978 where she played varsity basketball, volleyball, and tennis. Upon graduation, she enrolled at West Virginia State on a four-year basketball scholarship.

"Philly Val" as she was affectionately called, was the leading scorer for the West Virginia State Yellow Jackets for four years averaging 21 points her freshman year under Coach Gill Heasley. She set a WVSC record for most points scored when she scored 40 points against Fairmont State. She also broke the record of having the first 1,000-point career as a "Gold Gal" in the University's history during her junior year. Valerie was known to be an all-around basketball player with strong defense as well averaging seven rebounds and four steals a game.

As the captain of the basketball team, she led her teammates with strong leadership and maturity; carrying herself well on the floor, as well as off the court. During the off-season of basketball, she ran track under the leadership of Coach Glover Smiley.

In her sophomore year, she became a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated and became the vice president the following year. She later became president of Alpha Delta Chapter where she led the sorority in completion of various community projects. Valerie graduated from State in December of 1981 with a bachelor and associate degree in criminal justice

Ms. Colquitt Wright works as an administrator in the Human Service field and has been providing support services to others for over 35 years. In addition, she is co-founder of Golden Generations, Inc., a non-profit organization that focuses on providing housing to young ladies aging out of the foster care system and sole proprietor of Resource Development Institute. She is currently a member of the WVSU Philadelphia Alumni Chapter.

In 1994 she married the late Walter Wright and from that union had a son, Justin Jamal Wright.
