



A Brief History of

The WVSU National "W" Club

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics, as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, D.C., was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shenandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, W.Va. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishment of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on Oct. 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes. A special note of thanks to the late President Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.



Anthony L. Jenkins, Ph.D., West Virginia State University's 11th President effective July 1, 2016, is an established higher education leader committed to advocating for students and creating opportunity to higher education for all students, especially culturally under-represented groups.

Born in Washington D.C., and raised between our nation's capital and North Carolina, Jenkins is a vocal proponent for education and public policy issues. He has fostered meaningful dialogue within the national higher education community. His research, speeches and publications focus on crisis management, enrollment and retention, diversity, African-American male initiatives, first-generation college student success, state funding for higher education, mentoring and high-risk college campus behavior such as alcohol consumption and sexual misconduct.

Jenkins began his path to West Virginia State University as a United States Army veteran and first-generation college graduate. Jenkins earned a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies from Virginia Tech University, a Master of Science degree from North Carolina Central University, and a Bachelor's of Applied Science degree from Fayetteville State University.

Prior to leading the State family, Jenkins served as Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore and, most recently, as the Senior Associate Vice President for the University of Central Florida – the nation's second largest university. His career includes serving at Jackson State University, thereafter joining Virginia Tech's Housing and Residence Life and later the Office of the Dean of Students. He remained at Virginia Tech until becoming the Assistant Dean of Students at Northeastern Illinois University. He later served as the Associate Dean of Students at the University of North Carolina Wilmington; and was recruited to serve as the Dean of Students at the University of Houston-Clear Lake.

Jenkins is a Life-member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated, and is an active member of several higher education organizations. He is married to Toinette Jenkins and they have two daughters.

Dr. Orlando F. McMeans is currently the Chancellor of the Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center and the Dean of the College of Agricultural, Family and Consumer Sciences, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He began his new position on September 1, 2019. He also is a full tenured professor in the College of Agricultural Family and Consumer Sciences.

Dr. McMeans began his employment at West Virginia State University in November 1998 as the Director of the Department of Land-Grant Programs, and served in many capacities during his two decades at State: Vice President for Research and Public Service, the Executive Director of the WVSU Research and Development Corporation, and the Dean and Director of the WVSU Gus R. Douglass Land-Grant Institute.


He received the Bachelor of Science in Horticulture from Alabama A&M University and the Master of Science in Horticulture from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and earned the Ph.D. in Horticulture also at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. After graduating from the University of Illinois, he went on to do postdoctoral studies at Virginia Tech in the area of genetic engineering.

Dr. McMeans holds leadership positions in many national, regional and local organizations: Association of Public Land-Grant Universities (APLU); Association of Extension Administrators; Association of Research Directors; 1890 Deans Council; the American Society for Horticultural Sciences; West Virginia Science and Research Council; Experiment Station Committee on Organization and Policy; Minorities in Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Related Sciences; the USDA/1890 Executive Team; the APLU Board on Agriculture Assembly; APLU's Board on Advocacy Committee; APLU's Council for Agricultural Research, Extension, and Teaching; and APLU's Council on Governmental Affairs. He is a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., Prince Hall Freemasonry and The Loyal Order of the Moose.

Dr. McMeans is originally from Theodore, Ala., and is the proud son of Rosie M. McMeans Nettles and the brother of siblings Charles, LaTrenia and Tanjanika.

Dr. McMeans would like to give thanks and appreciation to The National "W" Club at West Virginia State University for this tremendous opportunity to be selected as an Honorary Member of the WVSU Sports Hall of Fame. William Bass is a native of Logan County coalfields in West Virginia, where he attended public school in the city of Logan. He learned his skills in football using tin cans and paper shaped into footballs on the sandlots in Logan along with Hall of Famers Cornelius Jones, John Gilmore, and Eddie Lee. He attended Aracoma High School for four years and after consolidation went to Logan High School his senior year. While in both schools, he participated in football, basketball, baseball, and track, lettering in all of those sports.

Bass was recruited by WVSU and received a Grant and Aid from the school, playing offensive end, defensive end, and defensive back. He played football all four years and was selected for the All-Conference team while playing in the WVIAC. Also, being an assistant to the boys' and girls' basketball teams under Coach Grant Gray and Coach Barbara Lewis, serving as the driver of the team automobile or van was a service he enjoyed while enrolled at State. William also set up the only intramural program, supervised by Dr. Charles Hawkins. As a player on the football team, William played in the positions of defensive end, outside line back, half back, and wide receiver under coaches Paul Talbott, Dick Tredway, and Grant Gray. A memorable play for him was during the game against Salem where he intercepted a pass and ran 48 yards to pay dirt! The final score of the game was 20-20. He also caught a 21-yard touchdown pass in the same game.

After graduating, he was employed by the Kanawha County Board of Education as a teacher at St. Albans Junior High School. He was an industrial arts teacher and assistant coach for three years, becoming the head coach of the football team and later the basketball team. After closure of the school in St. Albans, he was employed at South Charleston High School as a teacher, assistant coach in football and basketball and became Athletic Director for ten years. He became Vice-Principal until retirement.

William and his wife, Priscilla, have three children and eight grandchildren. Both he and his wife are graduates of WVSU.



Being Coach Poore's first recruit, Ron was a 3-year starter and captain, and set multiple season and career records. Known for his work ethic, leadership, and durability Ron increased his scoring average from 2 PPG to 10 PPG in his sophomore year and 16.2 PPG while averaging an amazing 40.6-MPG in his junior year. Ron battled a chronic knee injury his senior season but still earned WVIAC Second Team All-Conference with 14.7 PPG. Ron finished his career 7th in school history in points (1209) 1st in assists (354) 1st in 3pts made (253), 3pts in a game (9) 3pts in a season twice (91) & (93) second in FT% all-time .832% and currently holds a top 10 ranking in 12 different categories.

After leaving State, Ron started a career with PepsiCo but returned to WVSU as an assistant coach for the 2005-2006 WVIAC champions. Ron left coaching to play professionally in Germany with former WVSU teammate Tyrwone Still where he was Team Captain for 15-2 Capone Dusseldorf and a 20 PPG scorer before being injured.

Ron has now moved on to start his own Business Begr8 Athletics & Prints in his hometown of Cleveland Heights, Ohio. Ron is now a Mentor and coach for Youth sports and High School Basketball for Boys and Girls in the Cleveland Area.

Ron has started two scholarships that are awarded to a WVSU Basketball Senior and 3 Cleveland Heights High School Seniors in the name of former teammate Dondre Williams and Coach/Mentor Lamont E. Fields.

Ron is thankful for his parents, four sisters, three children, fiancé and all of his teammates, coaching staff, close friends, and everyone that has assisted him during his journey. A very special thanks to Coach Lamont Fields and Coach Bryan Poore for their unconditional beliefs in me.

Mark Steven Hairston, Sr., was born June 2, 1955 in Roanoke, Virginia and is one of twelve children born to the late Flora Hodnett and William Hairston Sr. Mark graduated in 1973 from Fort Hamilton High School in Brooklyn, New York where he excelled in baseball and basketball and was the starting point guard on a team that consisted of NBA Hall of Famer Bernard King.

After graduating from high school, Mark was recruited by Coach Curtis Price to play basketball at West Virginia State College. He participated on the WV State Junior Varsity team coached by Rance Berry for one year. In the spring of 1974, Mark was a walk-on for State's baseball team coached by Bob Maxwell. He was a three-year letterman, two-year starter and team Co-Captain of the 1978 baseball team. In 1977, Mark attained First Team, All-WVIAC honors in baseball as an outfielder. He began the 1978 baseball season as a returning starter for new head coach Cal Bailey.

In late March of 1978, Mark was confronted with a difficult decision where he had to devote his time to completing his student teaching to earn his degree in education. WV State's track and field coach Mike Smith got word that Mark could be available to participate on the track team and recruited him with the agreement that it would not interfere with his student teaching. Mark participated the entire 1978 outdoor track season and finished in second place in the men's individual 440-yard dash at the 1978 WVIAC Outdoor Track Meet. He also was the anchor on the WVSC first place 4x440 relay team. Mark garnered a fourth place finish in the 220-yard dash at the same meet. He had never run track prior to the 1978 season.

Mark became a Health and Physical Education teacher and Assistant Girls Basketball Coach and Head Baseball Coach at Patrick Henry High School in Roanoke, VA. He later pursued a Master' degree in Education and an Education Specialist Degree in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies. Mark retired from the Winston Salem/Forsyth County Schools where he was a two-time Principal of the Year Nominee.

Mark is the proud husband to Mary "Missy" Coles Hairston; proud father of three children; and grandfather to six grandchildren.

Dr. Leah Turner-Wilson was born April 14, 1985 in Norwalk, Ohio to Sheryl Wilson. She attended Norwalk St. Paul Catholic High School for the first three years of her high school career. After transferring to Norwalk High School, Leah joined the volleyball team and led the Norwalk Truckers to their second Ohio High School Volleyball Championship Tournament in school history. Leah was a multi-sport athlete in high school participating in volleyball, basketball, cheerleading, and setting all-time track records in the 300M hurdle and 100M hurdle events. She also raced BMX in the National Bicycle League, ranking number two in the nation and achieving a spot in the BMX World Championships in 2001.

At West Virginia State University, Leah and her teammates led the institution to it's first ever NCAA DII West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) volleyball regular season and tournament championships in 2006. As an outside hitter for the Yellow Jackets, Wilson-Turner accumulated 5 all-time records for the institution and amassed a hitting percentage that ranked her 6th in the nation among all NCAA DII volleyball athletes. She was the very first athlete in WVSU volleyball history to receive 1st team all-conference honors in 2004 and was awarded an all-conference honor all four years as a Yellow Jacket.

Leah graduated Cum Laude in 2007 with a Bachelor's degree in Biology/ Pre-Medicine while competing for the Yellow Jackets. She returned to the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics as a graduate student and finished her Master's degree in Biotechnology in 2009. Leah earned her Doctor of Philosophy degree in higher education from Ohio University as a Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) Doctoral Scholar Fellow. With the focus of her research on the college choices of under-served and under-researched athletes, her early post-doc career was dedicated to addressing prominent higher education issues such as access, retention, degree completion, student involvement, and satisfaction for first-generation scholar-athletes.

Leah currently lives in Austin, Texas with her children, Chandler and Lily. She serves the Jackson School of Geosciences at the University of Texas as the Program Director for GeoSTEM Workforce Development and Career Exploration, working within the diversity and outreach division to promote access for diverse and low-income youth.



Dr. Reed, is a former 24-year veteran teacher who moved on to become Superintendent of DC Public Schools as well as many other successes.

Dr. Reed is a proud graduate of West Virginia State College. In fact, as a defensive tackle at Sumner High School, in Missouri, he was given the opportunity to attend West Virginia State on a football scholarship. While at WVSC, his talents as defensive and offensive tackle earned him a place in the Football Hall of fame at his beloved Alma Mata.


In 1981, he became Assistant U.S. Secretary of Education with former President Reagan's administration. He was in charge of federal aid programs for elementary and secondary schools. Dr. Reed was one of the highest-ranking African Americans among the Reagan administration.
